1. Roll Call:

Present: Mayor Mark Spohn, Laurie Gehrt, Jason Cole, Lyndsey Baxter, Stephen Stubbs (zoom), Mary Lou Greim (zoom), and Mike Edwards. **Absent:** None.

Also Present: City Manager Molly McGovern, Public Works Director Chad Birdsong, Economic Development Director Melinda Mehaffy, Councilwoman Sonya Morgan, Councilman Reggie St. John, and Authority Secretary Susan Conyers.

- 2. <u>Approval Meeting Minutes of December 11, 2023</u>: Mike Edwards motioned to approve the December 11, 2023 meeting minutes; Jason Cole seconded. All in favor; motion approved.
- Approval Capital Improvements Financials through December of 2023: Molly McGovern, City Manager briefed the Authority of the Capital Improvements Budget Spreadsheets through December of 2023. Stephen Stubbs motioned to approve the Capital Improvements Financials presented through December of 2023; Jason Cole seconded. Roll Call of Votes: Ayes – Mike Edwards, Laurie Gehrt, Lyndsey Baxter, Stephen Stubbs, Mary Lou Greim, Jason Cole, and Mayor Mark Spohn. Nays – None. Motion approved.

4. <u>Approval – Request to Replenish Building Maintenance Fund</u>: City Manager Molly McGovern briefed the Authority of the request of \$25,000 to replenish the Building Maintenance fund. This fund is for City facilities to use and was last replenished in the fall. The Hall of Waters has a glycol system and boiler that need to be maintenance/repaired. Stephen Stubbs motioned to approve the request of \$25,000.00 to replenish the Building Maintenance Fund; Laurie Gehrt seconded. Roll Call of Votes: Ayes – Lyndsey Baxter, Mary Lou Greim, Jason Cole, Laurie Gehrt, Mike Edwards, Stephen Stubbs, and Mayor Mark Spohn. Nays – None. Motion approved.

5. <u>Approval – Fishing River Watershed Project 2</u>: City Manager Molly McGovern briefed the Authority of the Fishing River Watershed Project #2 and the anticipated need for \$450,000.00 in local match. Molly McGovern and Chad Birdsong explained the project, which is an 85/15 grant. The grant covers 85% and the City covers 15%. This would be a joint application with Prathersville. Stephen Stubbs motioned to approve the Fishing River Watershed Project #2, pending matching funds; Lyndsey Baxter seconded.

Roll Call of Votes: Ayes – Jason Cole, Laurie Gehrt, Stephen Stubbs, Lyndsey Baxter, Mike Edwards, and Mayor Mark Spohn. Nays – None. Motion approved.

6. <u>Approval – Industrial Roadway Improvements</u>: City Manager Molly McGovern briefed the Authority of the request of \$80,000.00 in matching funds from Capital Improvements for a CDBG grant for an industrial roadway improvement project. Lyndsey Baxter motioned to approve the request of \$80,000.00 for industrial roadway improvements to improve the intersection of St. Louis Avenue and South McCleary Road, St. Louis Avenue and Corum Road, and railway crossing improvements on S. McCleary Road; Mike Edwards seconded.

Roll Call of Votes: Ayes – Laurie Gehrt, Stephen Stubbs, Mary Lou Greim, Lyndsey Baxter, Mike Edwards, Jason Cole, and Mayor Mark Spohn. Nays – None. Motion approved.

- <u>Approval Transportation Trust Financials from July to December of 2023</u>: Public Works Director Chad Birdsong briefed and presented to the Authority the Transportation Trust Financials from the months of July through December of 2023. Laurie Gehrt motioned to approve the Transportation Trust Financials from July to December, 2023; Jason Cole seconded. Roll Call of Votes: Ayes – Mary Lou Greim, Mike Edwards, Stephen Stubbs, Jason Cole, Lyndsey Baxter, Laurie Gehrt, and Mayor Mark Spohn. Nays – None. Motion approved.
- 8. <u>Approval Transportation Trust Budget for Fiscal Year 2024</u>: Public Works Director Chad Birdsong briefed the Authority of the Transportation Trust Budget for the 2024 Fiscal Year to include requested allocations of \$983,768.58 for miscellaneous concrete repair fund, snow removal fund, infrastructure fund, 2024 Streetscape, and operating transfers to finance. Lyndsey Baxter motioned to approve the Transportation Trust Budget for Fiscal Year 2024; Stephen Stubbs seconded. Roll Call of Votes: Ayes Lyndsey Baxter, Jason Cole, Laurie Gehrt, Mary Lou Greim, Stephen Stubbs, Mike Edwards, and Mayor Mark Spohn. Nays None. Motion approved.
- **9.** <u>Comments</u>: Stephen Stubbs asked Chad Birdsong about the road core sampling approved at the last meeting and if they have done that yet. Chad noted the project kickoff meeting was scheduled for the next day to put the plan in place.

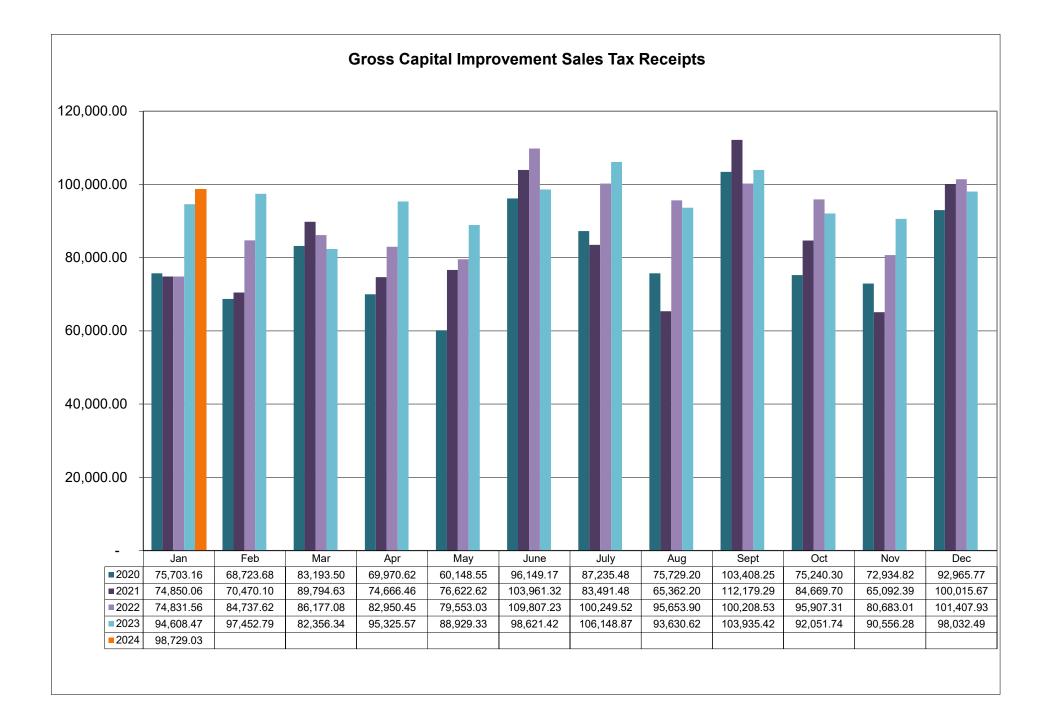

RE: Approval: Matching Funds

We would like to make some adjustments due to the timing of projects. Capital improvements has approved \$973,400 to be used as

local matching funds for the Dry Fork Greenway. This project is progressing on schedule with anticipation that bids will be opened for

construction in the fall, and a contractor selected before 12/31/24.

We have allocated \$700,000 in ARPA funds in matching grants for various projects:

-Matching Funds for the Garland Bridge Replacement - \$200,000

-Additional Funds for Garland Bridge if needed - \$159,000

-Matching Funds for replacement of N. Thompson Bridge and 143rd Street Bridge -

\$183,000. Federal funds were not approved

for these two bridges for the second year in a row. We considered increasing funding for the FY 24 Streetscape project approved

for Trans Trust funds with this funding.

-Matching Funds for the replacement of Wornall near Cornerstone - \$100,000 which will not likely be under contract until FY 2026.

-Matching Funds for the replacement of buses - \$58,000; MoDOT has indicated buses will not be purchased during FY 24, when is

re-evaluated annually, it will not be this year.

ARPA must be under contract before 12/31/24, so we would like to use \$700,000 in ARPA funds instead of CIP for the Dry Fork Project and move the \$700,000 in projects listed above to CIP.
